

Change Your Address with the AZ MVD

If you hold an Arizona driver's license or ID card and recently moved to a new address, you must notify the AZ MVD within 10 days. When you make the change of address with the MVD, **both your driver's** license and vehicle records will be updated.

NOTE: Changing your name with the AZ MVD will update your records only. If you'd like updated documents (i.e. driver's license, registration etc.) see "**Request Updated License/Registration/Title**" below.

You can change your address with the Arizona MVD **online**, **by phone**, or **in person** at your local <u>AZ</u> MVD branch office.

Online

You can <u>make a change of address online</u> at the AZ MVD website. The system will ask you to provide your:

- Full name.
- Birth date.
- Driver's license or ID card number.
- New address.

Afterwards, you can view and print your confirmation receipt. You'll also have the option to obtain an updated copy of your driver's license or ID card. There is a \$12 fee if you decide to order a replacement. *NOTE*: The online system will not allow you to process an address change during its scheduled maintenance between 11:50 p.m. and 12:10 a.m. (daily) and Sunday between 12 a.m. and 2 a.m.

By Phone

You can process your address change by calling the Arizona MVD at the following contact numbers:

In Person

To change your address in person with the Arizona MVD, you must:

- Visit your local <u>Arizona MVD office</u>.
- Provide your name, date of birth, and AZ driver's license or ID card number.
- Pay the \$12 replacement fee, if you would like to obtain replacement driver's license or ID card.

Request Updated License/Registration/Title

After requesting your address change, the Arizona MVD will update both your vehicle and driver's license records and any following correspondence will be sent to your new address.
